

**RESOLUTION ON THE DISPATCH OF THE PAN-AFRICAN
PARLIAMENT PEACE MISSION TO CÔTE D'IVOIRE AT THE
BEGINNING OF MAY 2005.**

(PAP-Res. 006/05)

The Pan African Parliament,

1. **RECALLING** rule 5(1)(a) of its Rules of Procedure;
2. **PLEASED** with the mediation by President Thabo Mbeki of the Republic of South Africa and the African Union to resolve the politico-military conflict in Côte d'Ivoire;
3. **CONSIDERING** the efforts by the various Heads of State to find a solution to the Ivorian conflict, as well as the success of the African Union in the resolution of conflicts in Africa;
4. **UNDERLINING** the determination of the PAP to contribute to the resolution of current conflicts on the African continent;
5. **PLEASED** with the manner in which the African Union manages the process of conflict resolution in Africa;
6. **EXPRESSING** its satisfaction at the avant-garde role and the commitment of the African Union in establishing peace and security in Africa;
7. **URGENTLY CALLING** upon the African Union to make every effort possible to resolve the conflict in Côte d'Ivoire, in particular, and in Africa in general;
8. **FURTHER URGENTLY CALLING** upon all the parties involved in conflict in Côte d'Ivoire to cooperate with the African Union and the peace brokers;
9. **EXHORTING** the warring parties to strictly observe the peace agreement;

THEREFORE RESOLVES to dispatch a Pan-African Parliament Peace Mission at the beginning of May 2005 to Côte d'Ivoire to make an assessment on the ground and to submit a report to the Pan-African Parliament.
