CONSIDERING Article 3 of Convention A/P2/5/82 regulating inter-State Road Transportation between ECOWAS Member States which states that the list of inter-State road axs is provisional and may be modified by Council of Ministers upon the recommendation of the Transport Commission;

ENACTS

Article 1

The 2002 Budget of the ECOWAS Regional Development Fund (ERDF) amounting to one hundred and eighty thousand two hundred Units of Account (UA 180,200) representing its operating expenses is hereby approved.

This amount shall be deducted from the capital resources of the ECOWAS FUND and be considered as start-up costs.

Article 2

The Managing Director of the ECOWAS Regional Development Fund shall be entrusted with the implementation of this Regulation.
