DAKAR, 15 - 17 DECEMBER, 2001**

REGULATION C/REG.13/12/01 ON ROADS THAT HAVE ASSUMED GREATER IMPORTANCE IN SUPPORTING INTRA-COMMUNITY TRADE AND CROSS-BORDER MOVEMENT

THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

MINDFUL of Articles 10, 11 and 12 of the treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions;

MINDFUL of Article 32 of the Treaty relating to cooperation in transport, communications and tourism;

MINDFUL of Decision A/DEC.20/5/80 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government dated 29th May 1980 relating to the Community Transport Programme;

MINDFUL of Decision C/DEC.8/12/88 of the Council of Ministers on the second phase of ECOWAS road projects relating to interconnecting roads for the opening up of the land-locked countries;

CONSIDERING Article 3 of Convention A/P2/5/82 regulating inter-State Road Transportation between ECOWAS Member States which states that the list of inter-State road axis is provisional and may be modified by Council of Ministers upon the recommendation of the Transport Commission;

ON THE RECOMMENDATION of the Transport, Communications and Tourism Commission which met in Cotonou from 25 to 27 July 2001;

ENACTS

Article 1

The following roads are hereby approved as part of the Community road axis:

MINDFUL of Decision A/DEC.4/12/99 relating to the transformation of the ECOWAS Fund into a Holding Company;

CONSIDERING the Report of the 19th meeting of the Ad hoc Ministerial Committee on the Enhancement of the Financial Resources of the Fund held in Lome, Togolese Republic, from 29 - 31 October, 2001

UPON RECOMMENDATION of the Ad hoc Ministerial Committee on the Enhancement of the Financial Resources of the Fund;

ENACTS

Article 1

The 2002 Budget of the ECOWAS Regional Development Fund (ERDF) amounting to one hundred and eighty thousand two hundred Units of Account (UA 180,200) representing its operating expenses is hereby approved.

This amount shall be deducted from the capital resources of the ECOWAS FUND and be considered as start-up costs.

Article 2

The Managing Director of the ECOWAS Regional Development Fund shall be entrusted with the implementation of this Regulation.

Article 3

This Regulation shall be published by the Executive Secretariat in the Official Journal of the Community within thirty (30) days of signature by the Chairman of the Council of Ministers. It shall also be published within the same time frame in the National Gazette of each Member State.

UPON RECOMMENDATION of the Ad hoc Ministerial Committee on the Enhancement of Financial Resources of the Fund;

ENACTS

Article 1

The 2002 Budget of ECOWAS Bank Investment and Development (EBID) amounting to two hundred and thirty-two thousand three hundred Units of Account (UA 232,300), representing its operating expenses is hereby approved. This amount shall be deducted from the capital resources of the ECOWAS Fund and be considered as start-up costs.

Article 2

The President of the ECOWAS Bank for Investment shall be entrusted with the implementation of this Regulation.

Article 3

This Regulation shall be published by the Executive Secretariat in the Official Journal of the Community within thirty (30) days of signature by the Chairman of the Council of Ministers. It shall also be published within the same time frame in the National Gazette of each Member State.
