

## PUBLIC ASSEMBLY ACT, 2015

(Act 15 of 2015)

AN ACT to repeal and replace the Public Order Act, 2013, to make provision for the protection and promotion of the right to freedom of assembly, the preservation of public safety and order and to provide for connected matters.

ENACTED by the President and the National Assembly.

1. This Act may be cited as the Public Assembly Act, Short tit 2015.

Penalty

14. Any person who commits an offence under this Act is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding SCR25,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years or to both such fine and imprisonment.

Regulations

15. The Minister may make regulations for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this Act.

Repeal of Act 4 of 2014

16. The Public Order Act, 2013 is hereby repealed.
