| “scheduled goods” means any of the goods specified in the Schedule hereto or any class of such goods. | |
| 3. Subject to paragraph 4 hereof, no person shall export out of Zambia any scheduled goods. | Export

| 4. Paragraph 3 hereof shall not apply to any scheduled goods which are— | Saving |
| (a) in transit through Zambia to a place beyond its borders;
or | |
| (b) exported under any licence if the exporter satisfies the Permanent Secretary in the Ministry responsible for commerce and industry that such exporter has, on the basis and by reason of his having been issued with or covered by any such licence, incurred a contractual and legally enforceable obligation prior to the coming into force of this Order. | |
| 5. Any licence other than a licence to which paragraph 4 hereof applies is hereby revoked. | Revocation
