The Customs and Excise Act (Laws, Volume XII, Cap. 662)

The Customs and Excise (Suspension) Regulations, 1987

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section eighty-nine of the Customs and Excise Act, the following Regulations are hereby made:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs and Excise (Suspension) Regulations, 1987.

Title

2. The duties appearing in the customs tariff, in so far as they apply to the goods appearing in the Schedule thereto, are suspended to an extent sufficient to reduce such duties to the effective rates shown in the Schedule.

Suspension of duties

3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the First Schedule to the Act, the duties chargeable on all sports goods (excluding those used in hunting, shooting and fishing) certified as such by the National Sports Council of Zambia and approved by the Controller are hereby wholly suspended.

Suspension of duties on certain sports goods

4. The Customs and Excise (Suspension) Regulations, 1970, are hereby repealed.
