## The Customs and Excise (Suspension) (Amendment) Regulations, 1998

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section *eighty-nine* of the Customs and Excise Act, the following Regulations are hereby made:

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Customs and Excise (Suspension) (Amendment) Regulations, 1998, and shall be read as one with the Customs and Excise (Suspension) Regulations, 1997, in these Regulations referred to as the principal Regulations.

Title and commencement S.I. No. 143 of 1997

(2) These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st January, 1998.

2. The Schedule to the principal Regulations is amended by the insertion in the appropriate places of the items set out in the Appendix to these Regulations.

officer being an adjudicator, the Chief Administrator shall ask one of the Judges or Magistrates as the case may be who has had an occasion to sit in appeal or revision over the judgments passed or orders made by the judicial officer, to make a report on the work and competence of the judicial officer.

(2) The Chief Administrator shall submit reports referred to in sub-regulation (1) together with comments thereon to the Commission, whereupon the Commission may, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these Regulations, direct that the judicial officer shall without any further proceedings be removed from office or make such other order as it thinks proper in the circumstances of the case.

50. Any judicial officer who submits any matter, for the consideration of the Commission, shall ensure that all relevant documents and papers are made available to the Commission. The Commission, may require the production of any further documents or information relevant to the matter under consideration.

51. All correspondence for the Commission from the Chief Administrator and other persons shall be addressed to the Secretary.

52. Any case not covered by these Regulations shall be reported to the Secretary and the Commission shall determine the procedure to be adopted.
