# The Customs and Excise Act (Laws, Volume 18, Cap. 322)

### The Customs and Excise (Remissions) (Mopani Copper Mines Plc) Regulations, 2000

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section eighty-nine of the Customs and Excise Act, the following Regulations are hereby made:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs and Excise Title (Remissions) (Mopani Copper Mines Plc) Regulations, 2000.

Remission of duty

2. (1) Subject to sub-paragraph (2) the Commissioner-General shall remit the whole duty payable on the goods set out in the Schedule to these Regulations when purchased or imported by Mopani Copper Mines Plc up to a value of two hundred and fifty million United States dollars.

(2) Notwithstanding sub-paragraph (1) the Commissioner-General shall—

- (a) remit duty under that sub-paragraph where the total duties payable is sixteen million United States dollars or less;
- (b) not remit duty under that sub-paragraph where the total duties payable exceed sixteen million United States dollars.

(3) The goods on which duty has been remitted under paragraph (1) shall not be sold or otherwise disposed of to any person not entitled to import them free of duty, except with the consent of the Commissioner-General and upon payment of duty, if any, at the rate leviable at the date of such sale or disposal.
