IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in Section *eight* of the Forests Act, the following Order is hereby made:

1. This Order may be cited as the National Forest No. F 17, Nsato (Alteration of Boundaries) Order, 2007. Title
2. The Boundaries of the National Forest No. F 17, Nsato, shall be altered by the deletion of existing boundary description thereof and the substitution therefor of the description set out in the Schedule to this Order. Alteration

SCHEDULE
(Paragraph 2)

NATIONAL FOREST NO. F 17, NSATO

Starting at International Boundary pillar BP23VIL on the D.R. Congo International Boundary, the boundary follows the International boundary between D.R. Congo and Zambia in an easterly and southern direction through beacons BP23V1, BP23V, BP23111, BP2311 and BP231D to beacon BP231; thence south-eastwards in a straight line through beacon W397 on a bearing of 137 degrees for a distance of approximately 2,650 metres to beacon NNF; thence westwards in a straight line on a bearing of 276 degrees for a distance of

approximately 4,700 metres to the source of Kafibale stream; thence down along the Kafibale stream on the right bank to its confluence with Mundela river; thence up along Mundela river northwestwards and northeastwards for a distance of approximately 7,500 metres to its confluence with unnamed tributary; thence northwestwards in a straight line on a bearing of 305 degrees for a distance of approximately 13,500 metres to International boundary pillar BP23VIL, the point of starting.

The above described area in extent 4,500 Hectares approximately is shown bordered green on Plan No. F/17 deposited in the office of the Surveyor-General signed by him and dated 19th June, 2006.
