The Defence Act (Laws, Volume 8, Cap. 106)

The Defence (Regular Forces) (Officers)(Amendment)Regulations, 2009

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in sections *twelve* and *two hundred* and ten of the Defence Act, the following Regulations are hereby made:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Regular Title Forces) (Officers)(Amendment)Regulations, 2009, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Regular Forces) (Officers) Cap. 106 Regulations, in these Regulations referred to as the principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 9 of the principal Regulations is amended—

(a) in sub-regulation (3)—

- (i) by the deletion of the number "50" after the words "age of" and the substitution therefor of the number "55"; and
- (ii) by the deletion of the proviso and the substitution therefor of the following proviso:

Provided that if the President considers that it is desirable in the public interest and on conditions to be agreed upon, the President may allow that officer to continue to serve in the Regular Force until the officer attains the age of 60 years, unless that officer gives notice of twelve months of the officer's intention to retire at the age of 55 years before attaining that age; and

(b) in sub-regulation (4)—

- (i) by the deletion of the number "55" after the words "age of" and the substitution therefor of the number "60"; and
- (ii) by the deletion of the proviso and the substitution therefor of the following proviso:

Provided that, if the President considers that it is desirable in the public interest, the President may allow that officer to continue to serve in the Regular Force for further periods, not exceeding twelve months at a time, until the officer attains the age of 65 years.
